








The Information Technology sector in Kerala has emerged as one of the biggest employment providers in the state. We have also witnessed a phenomenal increase in the number of IT entrepreneurs over the past five years.

Kerala's IT industry has played a crucial role in shaping up the evolving startup ecosystem in the state and helped create a new community of successful employers. Fuelled by a raft of industry-friendly measures of the Kerala government, Infopark has played a major role in Kochi's emergence as a major IT destination in India. With the completion of the second phase, the IT Park is firmly poised to emerge as one the biggest job creators in the state.

Infopark's IT exports have zoomed substantially to Rs 3,150 crore in 2014-15 from Rs 2,350 crore in the previous year. This is a significant growth compared to the past few years. # CEO'S REPORT

2014 has been a 'year of achievement' for Infopark, which has poised an enviable position among India's leading IT investment destinations. The Nasscom projects 13- 15 % growth in the IT-ITeS sector. The IT export during financial year 2014-15 made a striking 32% jump and touched Rs 3,150 crore, which point to a bright future for the industry in the state. Since its inception in 2004, Infopark has been able to attract investments from industry leaders and infrastructure developers like TCS, Wipro, Cognizant Technologies, ACS-Xerox, IBS Software Services, UST Global et along with MNC's like Ernst & Young Global Shared Services, KPMG, Fragomen, EXL services, Macfadyen, etc. Apart from those, Infopark has also given land on long lease to co-developers for developing their IT parks where Carnival Group, Brigade and LuLu Group have already commenced operations.

I am extremely happy to point out that Infopark, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary, has developed infrastructure for 220+ IT companies employing over 25,000 professionals. With the ongoing construction works getting into completion, we plan to touch 6 million square feet of IT space by the turn of this year. For the ambitious Rs 2,500 crore phase II project, Infopark has completed the basic infrastructure including power station, internal roads, water supply etc and could lease out over 60% of land successfully to IT/ITeS companies and co-developers. Cognizant campus is ready for operations while Infopark 4 lacs square feet building construction is fast progressing and is expected to be ready for operations by the turn of 2015. Further, Infopark has joined hands with several global IT companies and infrastructure developers like UST Global, Trans Asia, Media Systems, Claysys Technologies already. This year we were able to bring in investments from Muthoot IT, Padiyath Innovation world, Caspian Techpark as well. Also as a part of creating the 'walk-to-work' township, we were able to tender out an international school in Phase-II.

Infopark is scripting new chapters in its success story with the two satellite centres in Cherthala and Thrissur, under 'Hub & Spoke model'. Infopark Cherthala has 2.4 lakh square feet IT building is operational, with a full-fledged infrastructure including own power station. Construction of new 3.3 lakh sq ft IT building at Infopark Thrissur is nearing completion and will be open for business by the end of this year. Over 3,000 new job opportunities are expected to be created, once the new facility becomes fully operational.

The World Trade Centre (WTC), being developed by Brigade Group in the campus, will help global companies to launch their business in Kochi and also facilitate the city's growth as a major business outsourcing hub. The Kochi centre will have a total workspace of 7.70 lakh sq ft. Being built in two phases, WTC is expected to create 8,000 new jobs. Along with this, Brigade also started developing the 5 star hotel project in Phase 1, which will be complete by 2017.

Infopark in association with NASSCOM is setting up a start-up warehouse facility inside the park, the first of its kind in the state. We are providing 6500 sq.ft, plug and play area furnished as per the specification of NASSCOM along with the infrastructure required for the smooth functioning of the facility. This is going to give a boost to the entrepreneurial ecosystem in the state and bring more investments in the park through the association with NASSCOM.

I thank the state government for its continued support & guidance. I also thank Infopark staff for their sincerity and hard work Thank You







#### **Report on Financial statements**

We have audited the attached financial statements of Infoparks Kerala, a Society registered under the Travancore Cochin Literary Scientific and Charitable Societies Act 1955('the Act"), which comprise Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2015, the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

#### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Society. This responsibility included the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error

### Basis of Qualified Opinion

1. No provision for income tax has been made in the current year, as the assessment made against the Society by denying the exemption granted to it as a charitable Institution, has been challenged by filing an appeal before the Income Tax authorities.

### Qualified Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the effects of the matters described in the basis of qualified opinion given above, the aforesaid financial statements are in agreement with the books of account and give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India.

b) In the case of the Statement of Income and Expenditure, of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.

# **Schedule 15**

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts forming part of the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended 31st March 2015.

#### **Significant Accounting Policies**

- 1. The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost conventions and on accrual basis, except for insurance claims and interest on delayed rent receipts.
- 2. Fixed Assets are carried at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Cost of fixed assets includes all expenses wholly and exclusively meant for acquiring/creating fixed assets. Amounts received as liquidated damages from contractors, for delay in execution of work, are reduced from the cost of Fixed Assets. Physical verification of assets is being done periodically.
- 3. Depreciation has been charged on written down value method. In respect of assets which have been acquired or capitalized during the year, depreciation has been charged from the date of addition /capitalization at the same rate as provided in the previous year.
- 4. Grant received from Government of Kerala during the year for acquisition of capital assets has been credited to Capital Fund Account
- 5. In respect of lands acquired for Infopark, liability for additional compensation, if any payable, is recognized at the time of actual payment on the basis of court orders.
- 6. Electricity charges have been shown at net of amounts paid and recoveries made.
- 7. Lease premium receipts for the land leased on long term basis to co-developers are credited to Corpus Fund.

### **Notes to Accounts**

- 8. During the year Infopark has received an amount of Rs. 48.70 Crores as grant from Govt. of Kerala for various infrastructural projects. This amount has been credited to the Capital Fund
- 9. Sundry Debtors, Sundry Creditors, Loans & Advances and Deposits are subject to reconciliation and confirmation.
- 10. As per the minutes of the meeting of the PIB held on 30.12.2003, it was decided to handover the physical possession of the Power Distribution System to KEPIP (Kinfra Export Promotion Industrial Parks Limited). No financial entry has been passed in respect of the handing over. The cost of Power Distribution System is appearing in the books of Infopark and the depreciation for the assets is charged in its books.
- 11. Interest on Fixed deposits amounting to Rs.4,28,46,937 /- has been credited to Corpus Fund during the year.
- 12. No Provision for employee benefits as specified in AS -15 has been made in the accounts. Gratuity and leave encashment is accounted for on cash basis.
- 13. Other Receivables includes Rs.1,12,89,879/- being the balance of mobilization advance given to M/s.Farooq Construction. A suit has been filed in Sub Court, Ernakulam, for the recovery of the amount along with damages and is pending. The contract with them has been terminated.
- 14. Income Tax assessment for the Assessment Year up to 2011-12 has been completed and the Assessment Year wise details are as below.

In raising the demand, the department has denied the exemption under section 11 of the Income Tax Act, in view of the amendment of Section 2(15) of the Income Tax Act. Infopark had filed an appeal before the CIT (Appeals) against the demands, challenging the denial of exemption under section 11 and the applicability of section 2(15) to it ,but it has been turned down. Hence Infoaprk has preferred an appeal before the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal, Ernakulam. CIT (Appeals) Thiruvanathapuram has recently held in the case of Technopark, Trivandrum, whose constitution and business is similar in nature as that of Infopark, that they are not covered by the amendment and they can claim exemption u/s 11. As the appeal is pending and in view of the favourable judgment in the case of the Technopark, no provision for Income Tax and Deferred Tax as specified in AS.22 has been made in the accounts. Accordingly, Cash Flow Statement as specified in AS-3 has not been drawn. The Income Tax Dept. has preferred an appeal at the Supreme Court against the decision of the Hon. High Court of Kerala in the matter of deduction of income tax at source on payment for purchase of land for Infopark. The matter is pending before the court and no provision for the same is made in the accounts.

- 15. Infopark has preferred an Appeal to the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, against the decision of the Hon. District Court, Ernakulum awarding an amount of Rs. 241.07 lakhs, in a suit filed by B. E. Billimoria & Co against Infopark. No provision has been made in the accounts for the amount, as the matter is pending before the Hon.High Court.
- 16. The South Indian Bank had sanctioned a loan of Rs. 5,066 lakhs towards Infopark Cherthala project. The Loan outstanding as on the date of Balance Sheet is Rs.4688.85 lakhs. The primary security for the loan is the equitable mortgage of 9 acres of land. Since the Infopark Cherthala project has been substantially completed and capitalized, an amount of Rs.434.49 lakhs, being a portion of the interest paid during the year on Term Loan, has been recognized as revenue expenditure. The remaining Interest amounting to Rs.37.55 lakhs has been added to the capital work-in-progress as specified in AS 16.
- 17. As per GO (MS) No: 17/09/ITD dated 25/7/2009, Infopark will create all basic infrastructure for the IT Parks at Cherthala, Ambalapuzha and Thrissur (Koratty) in the land owned by Kerala State Information Technology Infrastructure Ltd (KSITIL). Based on the above GO a lease agreement has been executed between KSITIL and Infopark on 21/03/2012 and as such Infopark shall create all infrastructures for the development of IT Park at Cherthala. Infopark shall manage and maintain the Park and shall collect all civic and other utility charges from users of the park. An area of 9.00 acres of land has been leased to Infopark for a period of 90 years. Out of the above, an area of 6.60 acres of land was leased free of cost and for the balance of 2.40 acres of land for an amount of Rs. 115.20 lakhs. This lease premium payable has been capitalized .Of this, an amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs bas been paid, and the balance is payable at a later date. This is shown under Other Non-current Liability.
- 18. Unutilized portion (Rs.103.10/- lakhs-) of amount received for Smart City Project has been shown under Current Liabilities.
- 19. An amount of Rs.394.67 lakhs has been incurred for the IT Park at Ambalapuzha. This amount has been shown under Capital Work in Progress. Govt. of Kerala vide G.0 (MS) No.43/2010/ITD dated 10.12.2010 has sanctioned to relocate the IT Park to another location at Ambalapuzha due to environmental reasons. During the financial year 2012-13, in a joint meeting held by the Hon. Ministers for Industry and Forests, it was decided that the Department of Forests will explore the alternative utilization of the land. The amount spent will be appropriately treated in the books when final decision is made in this regard
- 20. During the year, Infopark has capitalized various assets amounting to Rs.2156.72 lakhs out of the work in progress, on completion of work.
- 21. In respect of TDS receivable relating to Assessment years, 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08, the Management is following up with the Income Tax department for the refunds.

- 23. Sundry debtors include an amount of Rs.38, 07, 769/- due from M/s Blue Lab Technology Solutions Pvt. Ltd who vacated the premises in September 2010. The party has given a security deposit of Rs.11,78,160. Infopark has filed a suit for recovery of the amount and the suit is pending. A case has also been filed u/s 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act on dishonor of cheques given by the company. All these cases are pending.
- 24. During the year 2013-14, Infopark had capitalized boundary wall at Infopark Koratty for an amount of Rs.2,10,52,819 /- as there was lack of clarity as to the ownership in the absence any agreement with Kerala State IT Infrastructure Limited(KSITIL). Subsequently, it has been confirmed that the ownership of the asset shall vest in KSITIL and hence, during the year, capitalization has been reversed. The depreciation pertaining to this asset of Rs.5.19 lakhs, claimed in the financial year 2013 14 has also been reversed and the effect of this has been shown as prior period item.
- 25. Previous year's figures have been re-grouped or re-classified wherever necessary to suit current year's lay out.
